



Every year, Rowan art students who have completed eight foundation studio classes must go through a Core Review in order to proceed with the program, according to the Art Department's course requirements. The Core Review requires that students submit 10 completed pieces of work which exhibit techniques learned from the foundation classes. The faculty of the Art Department converse about the students' drawings, paintings and sculptures. This gives them the opportunity to see how the students are progressing, according to professor Daniel Chard, who has taught at Rowan for 39 years. After critiquing the work, the faculty selects 40 works to be displayed in the Westby Gallery.

This semester, the exhibition was used to open the Westby Gallery and show incoming students what they needed to work toward. The students' work will remain on display until Sept. 15. Westby Gallery's hours are Monday - Thursday from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. and Saturday from 12 - 4 p.m.
